What is Hochatown?

Hochatown is the unincorporated community sandwiched between Broken Bow Lake and Beavers Bend State Park. It's the social and culinary center of the Broken Bow area — home to over 1,500 vacation cabins, a dozen restaurants, multiple breweries and wineries, and shops lining Highway 259A.

Tip: Hochatown does not have a major grocery store — for big trips, hit Walmart in Broken Bow (15 min south) before checking into your cabin.

bullet Beavers Bend Mining Co. — sluice for gems and arrowheads
